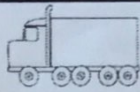

deport – v. to force a person who is not a citizen to leave a country. *The government may deport a criminal if he is not a citizen.*

import – v. to bring a product into a country to be sold. *The United States imports goods from other countries.*

portable – n. easy to carry or move around. *The portable radio requires batteries in order to work.*

teleport – v. an imaginary phenomenon in which a person or object is moved across a distance instantly. *The alien was able to teleport to his home planet and back within minutes.*

transport – v. to take or carry people or goods from one place to another by means of transportation. *A barge can transport dozens of new cars at one time.*

complement – n. something that completes something else or makes it better. *Marley purchased a pair of brown shoes as a complement to her new brown purse.*

compatible – adj. able to exist together without trouble or conflict; able to be used together. *I bought a printer that is compatible with my new computer.*

converge – v. to move toward one point and join together; to come together and meet; to come together and have one interest, purpose, or goal. *Students converged in the parking lot after school to celebrate.*

conspire – v. to secretly plan with someone to do something that is harmful or illegal; to happen in a way that produced bad or unpleasant results. *The criminals conspire to rob the bank and make a getaway.*

coordinate – v. to make arrangements so that two or more people or groups of people can work together properly and well; to look good with another color, pattern, style, etc. *Betsy worked for weeks to coordinate the perfect wedding for the bride and groom.*
